Actress Ann Sothern will be artist-in-residence at Jacksonville University Sept. 17-20 during which time she will conduct a workshop on the Stanislavsky method of acting for JU students.

Miss Sothern will hold a Fine Arts Collegium on Sept. 18 at 3 p.m. in Swisher Auditorium which is open to the public, free of charge. She will also be an honored guest at a tea given by the Jacksonville University Friends of the Fine Arts in the home of Mrs. A. D. Davis at 700 Old Grove Manor on Sept. 17 at 3 p.m.

A star in many movies, Miss Sothern became a favorite with home viewers of television in her two hit series "Private Secretary" and "The Ann Sothern Show. Other numerous television activities include her Countess role on seven "Lucy" shows; "My Mother, the Car" a series in which Miss Sothern was not seen but heard as the voice of the car; "Love American Style"; and guest star on Movies of the Week.

She returned to motion pictures with a critically acclaimed portrayal of a greedy woman of the streets in "Lady in a Cage", a key role in "The Best Man", and portrayed a cashier in a honky-tonk penny arcade in "Sylvia." Miss Sothern is currently starring in two movies, "The Killing Kind" and "Golden Needles."

She is very much at home on the stage having starred in theatrical productions of "Mame", "Gypsy", "Barefoot in the Park", "Glad Tiddings", "My Daughter, My Son", "Solid Gold Cadillac", "Butterflies Are Free", "Glass MORE
